

WELLCOME TO THE MIX

HEY YOU LEGEND -

You've done the hard part: Writing and sweating through the takes. Now it's time to let those tracks shine. Thanks for trusting me with your music — seriously, it means a lot.

Now it's time to turn all that raw power into a mix that kicks ass, nails your vision, And packs the punch that melts faces and snatches souls!

📦 File delivery guide

This little guide will help you deliver your files the right way, so we can spend less time fixing and more time mixing.

Let's make it thunder - no compromises, no holding back

1. EXPORT STEMS CLEAN

- No master bus processing, EQ, compression or limiting unless it's absolutely essential to the sound.
 Mono files as mono, stereofiles as stereo simple, yet important!
- Bounce/ Export each track from bar 1, beat 1, even if it doesn't come in right away.
 - -Think of these files like raw ore. The mix is where we forge it into steel.

2. ARRANGE + LABEL LIKE A PRO

- Arrange tracks so that it makes sence. Drums, Perc, Basses, Guitars, Keys, Vocals (45Leadvox, 46Lead dbl) Exept. If your "bridge lead theme-sound" consists of synths, guitars and violin, pack them next to each other
- Name your files clearly with number in front: 01BDin, 02BDout, 03SNtop, 45LeadVox_Main, etc.
- Avoid things like Audio_01.wav or finalfinal_realtake3.wav.
 - -If I have to guess what a track is, I'll have to ask. If I have to ask, we lose time.

3. CONSOLIDATE & INCLUDE EVERYTHING

- Don't send partials include all tracks that are part of the final sound.
- If you've used amp sims, MIDI instruments, or special FX render them to audio unless we've agreed otherwise.
 If you have "explosion-riser-sweep delay-automation madness" -export it to a single file. No need to replicate good FX. Same goes for crucial vocal delay throws. If we want to hear it just like that, lets have it on separate file.
 - -No plugin guessing games. What you hear is what I need to hear.

4. TEMPO & (KEY INFO)

• Include tempo (BPM) and optionally key of the song in a text file or the folder name. Example: SongName_125BPM_Dmin.

5. REFERENCE MIXES (OPTIONAL BUT HELPFUL)

- If you have a rough mix, demo, or commercial reference send it along.
- It helps me understand your taste, vibe, and where you want this beast to go.

6. PACK IT PROPERLY

- Put everything in one folder per song.Zip it up. Use a service like WeTransfer or Dropbox etc.
- Send the link not individual files.

■ SUMMARY CHECKLIST

- [] Session in good arrangement before bouncing[] All stems bounced from bar 1, beat 1
- Clear file names
- [] Everything rendered to audio (include autotunes, producer-delay throws or such vital FX)

Just the final stereo mix—WAV preferred, no limiter on the master bus if possible.
